Background	Sexual exploitation and abuse (SEA) is an extreme form of abuse of power for sexual purposes where, for example, humanitarian and development workers take advantage of the vulnerability of the people they are meant to serve. SEA can happen in settings ranging from full humanitarian crises to peace and development - wherever people are vulnerable and require humanitarian assistance. The United Nations (UN) should do all it can to ensure beneficiaries and community members are safe from SEA. This is a moral imperative.
	As part of the UN's strategy (A/71/818) to combat SEA, this issue is being acknowledged as a system-wide one and, as a result, requires a common and coordinated approach. Therefore, as part of his strategy, the UN Secretary-General (SG) has asked Agencies, Funds and Programmes to adopt new measures and strengthen existing ones to better prevent, detect, report and take action against personnel, who commit these inexcusable and abhorrent acts.
	The UN Timor-Leste is committed to working towards a society where our personnel, our partners, the beneficiaries of the programme, and the wider population of Timor-Leste can enjoy the fundamental rights to live with dignity and respect, and free of any form of violence, discrimination and SEA.
